About The Program: The Canyonlands Fund Training Program is the perfect summer opportunity for college students looking to combine meaningful work experience and mentorship with the most fun aspects of summer. The Program consists of two parts:

1. Management Training & Mentorship: Through hands-on training with the Canyonlands Fund Partner Services team, participants will get an inside look at all aspects of buying and operating an outdoor recreation business. A series of virtual trainings will take place in late May or early June. Participants will be assigned a mentor from the Canyonlands Partner Services enabling them to have a personal connection with the Canyonlands team. Mentors will provide Participants with resume feedback and career coaching. All Participants will learn about the following industry and functional areas:

2. Summer Camp Experience: You'll be matched with one of Canyonlands' three sleepaway camps. You'll have all the same responsibilities as other camp staff and may have the opportunity to work on special projects at the intersection of your interests and the camp's needs.

- Rising sophomore or junior at a top-tier undergraduate institution.
- Minimum 3.0 GPA.
- Willing to work hard-including long hours & getting your hands dirty.
- Motivated self-starter with a strong desire to take on new challenges and learn as much as possible.
- Able to pass all applicable background and reference checks.

Preferred Qualifications:

- Track record of taking initiative: eager to both provide and gain value from the experience.
- Attended camp sleepaway or day camp.
- Experience working with children and/or passionate about youth development.
- Believe all youth deserve social and emotional education.
- Committed to conservation and environmental stewardship.
- Love dogs.
